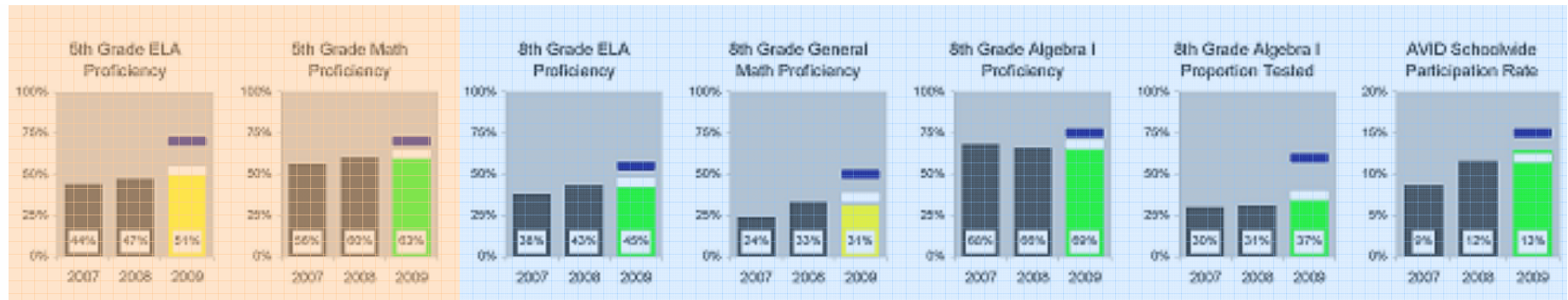
Green = Achieved Annual Target

Elementary School

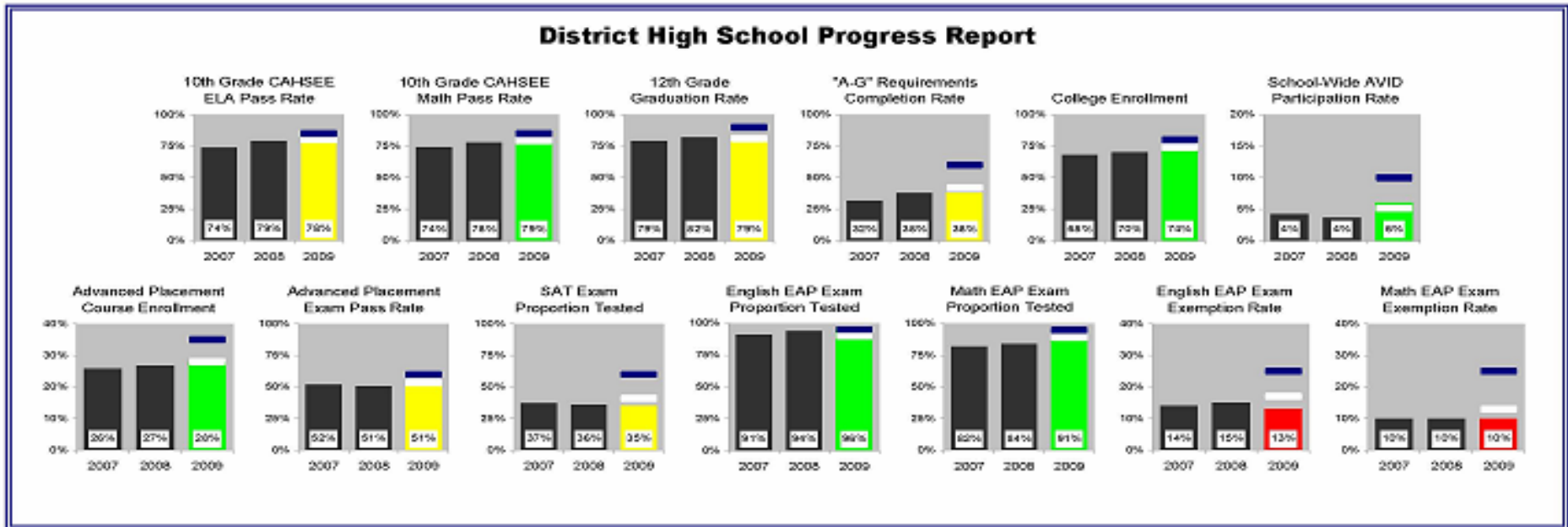
- Both metrics are within one percentage point of the 2009 Target.

Middle School

- Four of the five metrics meet or exceed the 2009 Target.

General Trends: High School



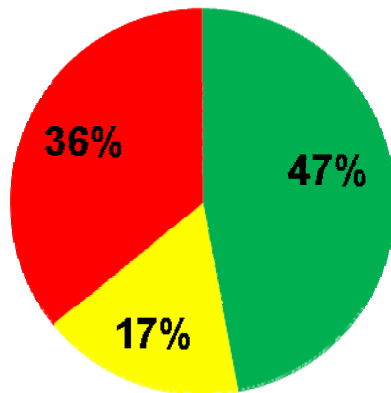
High School

- Six of the thirteen metrics meet or exceed the 2009 Target (green).
- Two metrics are “far below” the 2009 Target (red).

School-Level Data: Elementary Schools

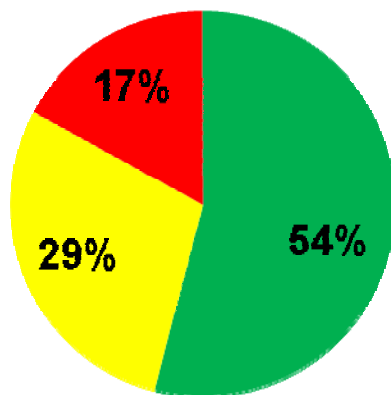
5th Grade ELA Proficiency



District: **Yellow**

- Nearly half (47%) of the schools are at or above the 2009 Target.
- Slightly over a third (36%) of the schools are in the red.

5th Grade Math Proficiency

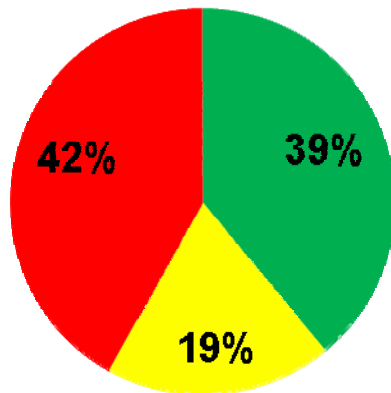


District: **Green**

- Over half (54%) of the schools are at or above the 2009 Target.
- Ten schools (17%) are in the red.

School-Level Data: Middle Schools

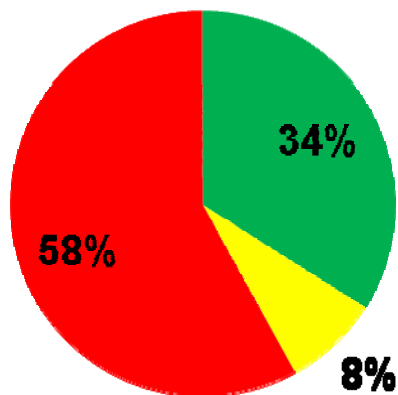
8th Grade ELA Proficiency



District: **Green**

- Ten schools (39%) are at or above the 2009 Target.
- Eleven schools (42%) are in the red.

8th Grade General Math



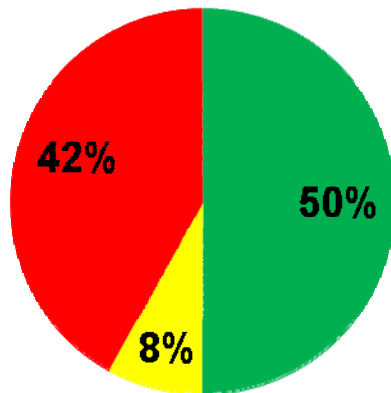
District: **Yellow**

- Over a third (54%) of the schools are at or above the 2009 Target.
- Nearly three out of five schools (58%) are in the red.



School-Level Data: Middle Schools

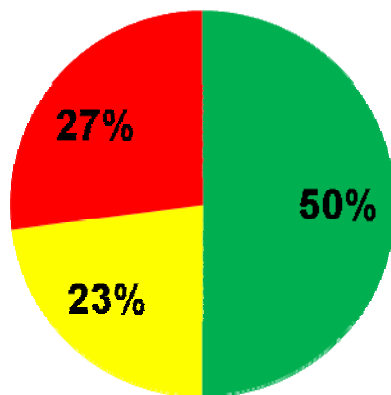
8th Gr. Algebra I Proficiency

District: Green

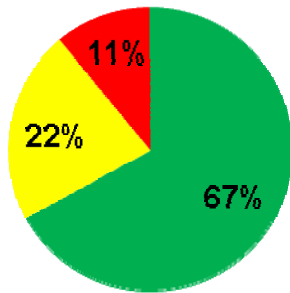
- Half of the schools are at or above the 2009 Target.
- About a quarter of the schools (27%) are in the red.



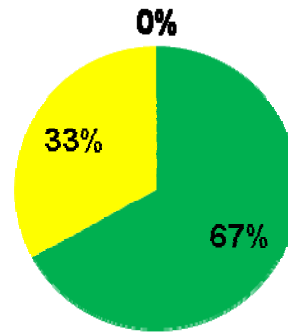

For each of the following metrics, six of the schools (67%) are at or above the 2009 Target.

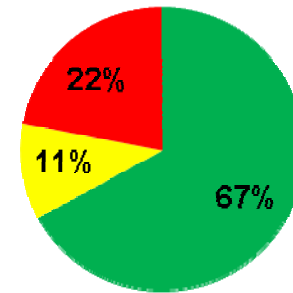
10th Gr. CAHSEE Pass (ELA)



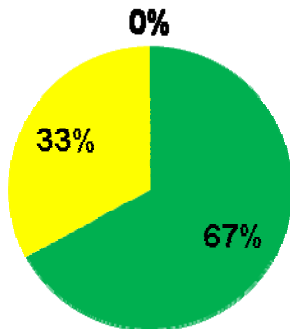
12th Gr. Graduation Rate



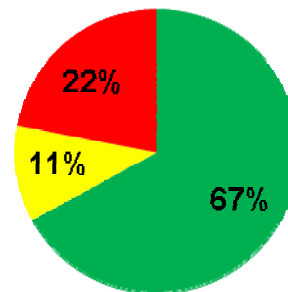
EAP Math (% Tested)

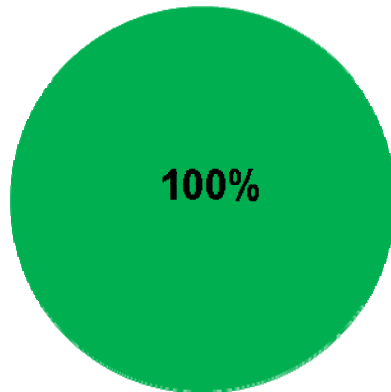

Notable School-Level Data: High Schools

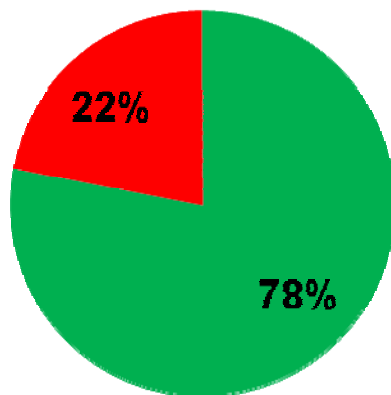
EAP ELA (% Tested)

AVID Participation



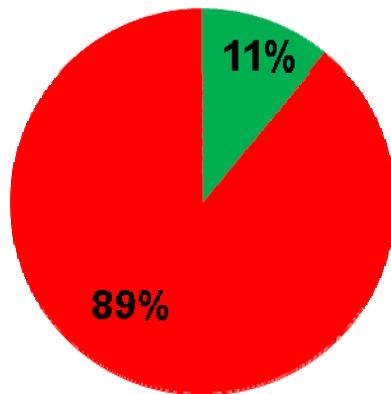
District: Green

Notable School-Level Data: High Schools

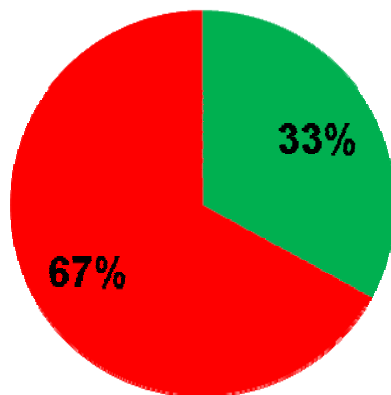
EAP Math Exemption

EAP ELA Exemption

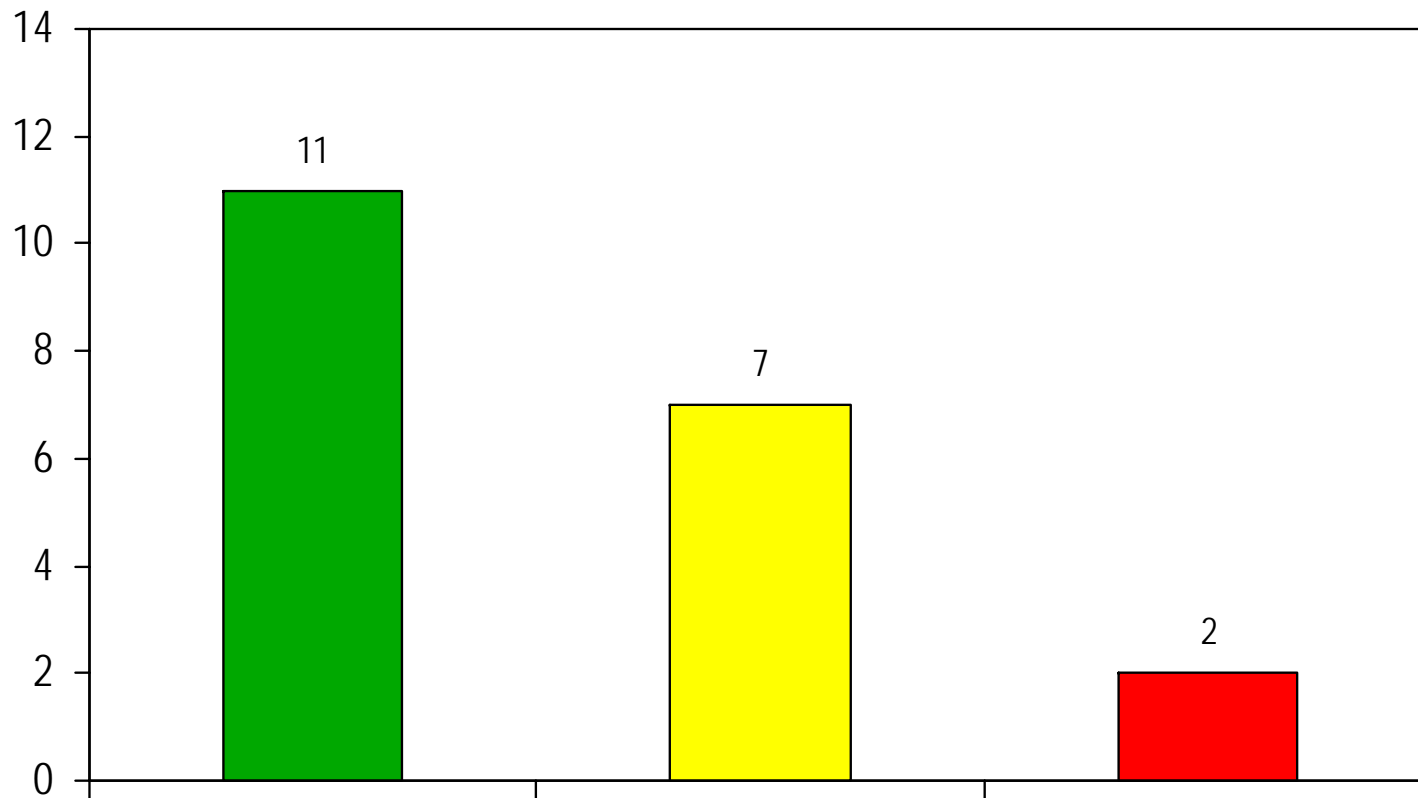


District: **Red**
